- A completed patent form is annotated by a barrister and can then be submitted by mail to the patent agency to receive a certificate that includes a patent number.
- The local Business Review Panel will meet quarterly to select viable plans to be forwarded directly to the NYSC national headquarters for nationwide compilation and submission to the Innovation Fund headquarters.
- The Innovation Fund will be an independent foundation operated by a board whose members are from the private sector.
- Submissions approved and selected by this body will get a seed fund that is specifically tailored for the particular project.
- This board helps with management, technical and marketing support and also will seek venture capital from overseas.
- After 5 years the Federal Government will voluntarily offer the other 2 partners, the owners (corps members 5 years ago!) and the participating Investment Banks, the option to buy out its equity stake plus annual interest if the company succeeds.
- The selection process must be completed in 12 months; Corpers to Entrepreneur agenda.
- This process will accommodate submissions from excorps members, students and every Nigerian with sellable ideas.
- A online clearing house will weekly publish and archive ALL patented submissions and status to ensure transparency and, unsuccessful submissions may benefit from being picked by investors and venture capitals from within and outside the country for funding.



- A Business Review Panel comprising of volunteer successful local business leaders in each zone that examines business plans submitted by corps members in the zone.
- Corper(s) with novel business plans/ideas or innovations will patent such using patent application forms from their local post office or from the official website of the Nigeria Patent Agency. This agency will be under the Ministry of Justice.
